

What is a parable?

Parable



- Brief and symmetrical stories. Unnecessary details are left out.
- Leave no room for gray areas.
- The listener is forced to see the truth in concrete rather than abstract pictures.
- The settings in the story are taken from ordinary life.
- Parables ask listeners to make judgments on the events of the story.
- They force the listener to make a decision or come to a moment of truth.
- As a result, listeners must make similar judgments in their own lives.



heaven and his father


He would rather be common

Luke 15:20-24

20 So he left and went to his father. “While the son was still a long way off, his father saw him coming and felt sorry for him. So he ran to him and hugged and kissed him. **21** The son said, ‘Father, I have sinned against God and have done wrong to you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son.’ **22** “But the father said to his servants, ‘Hurry! Bring the best clothes and put them on him. Also, put a ring on his finger and good sandals on his feet. **23** And bring our best calf and kill it so that we can celebrate with plenty to eat. **24** My son was dead, but now he is alive again! He was lost, but now he is found!’ So they began to have a party.
