# Class Norms

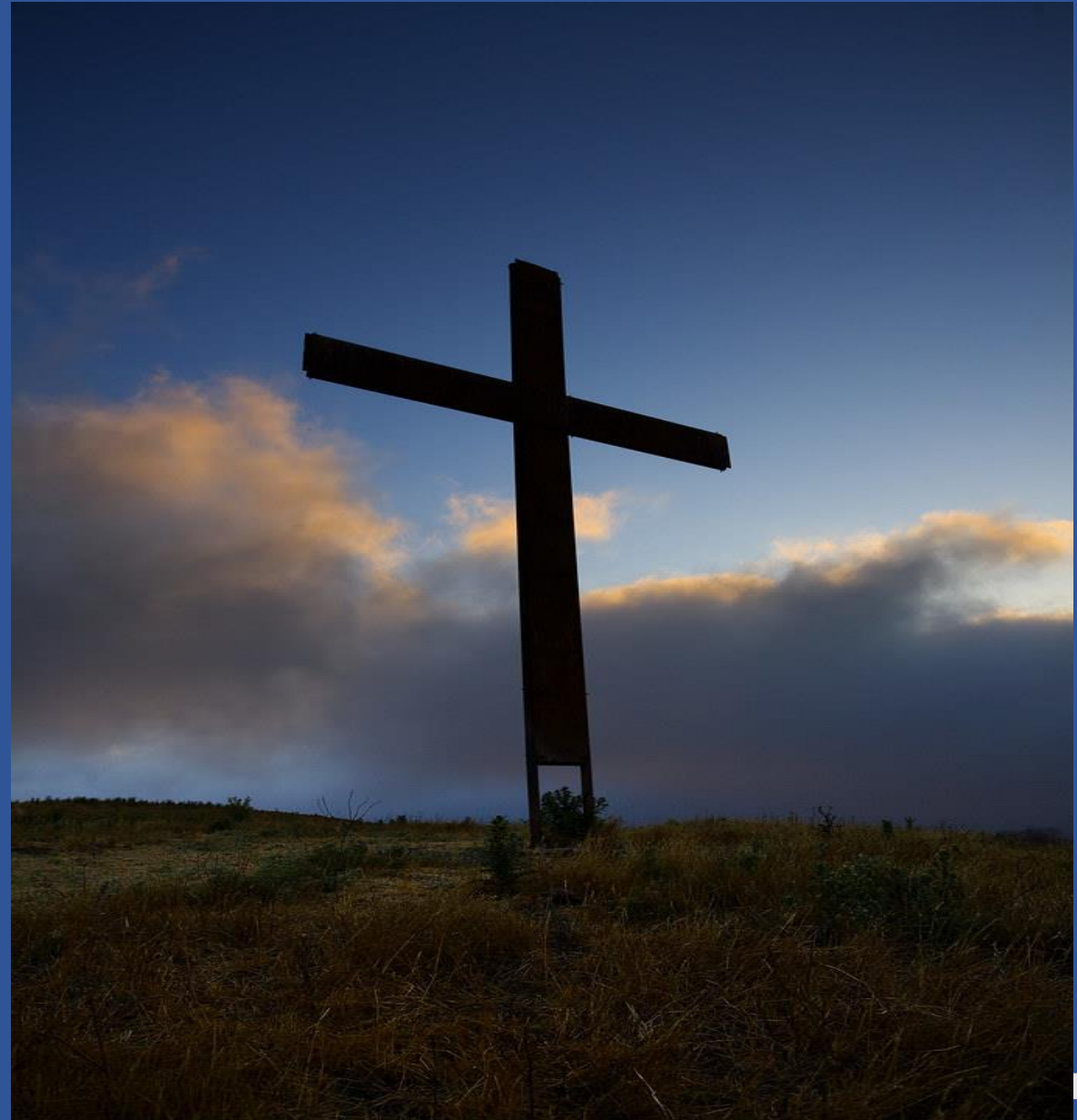

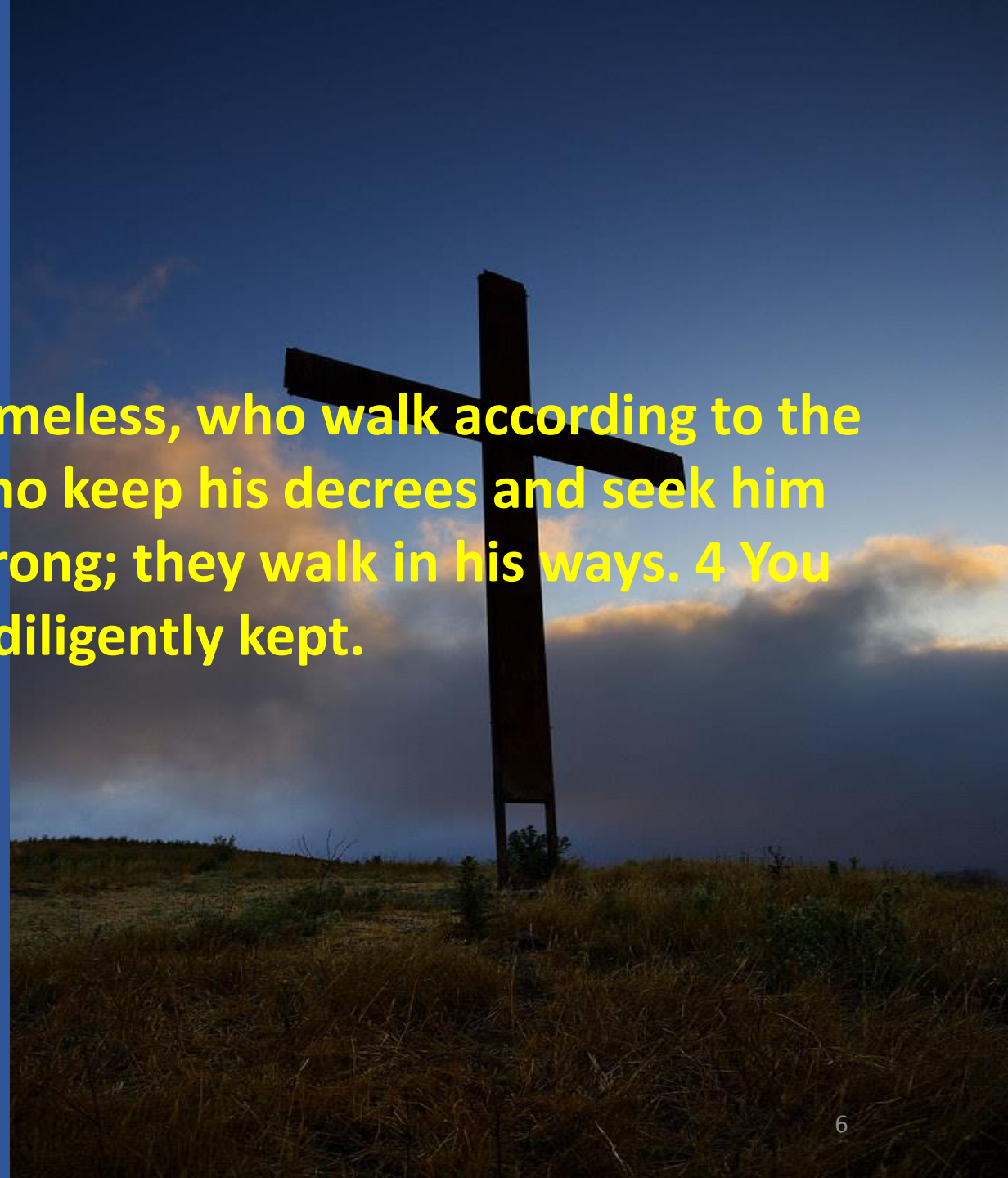

---

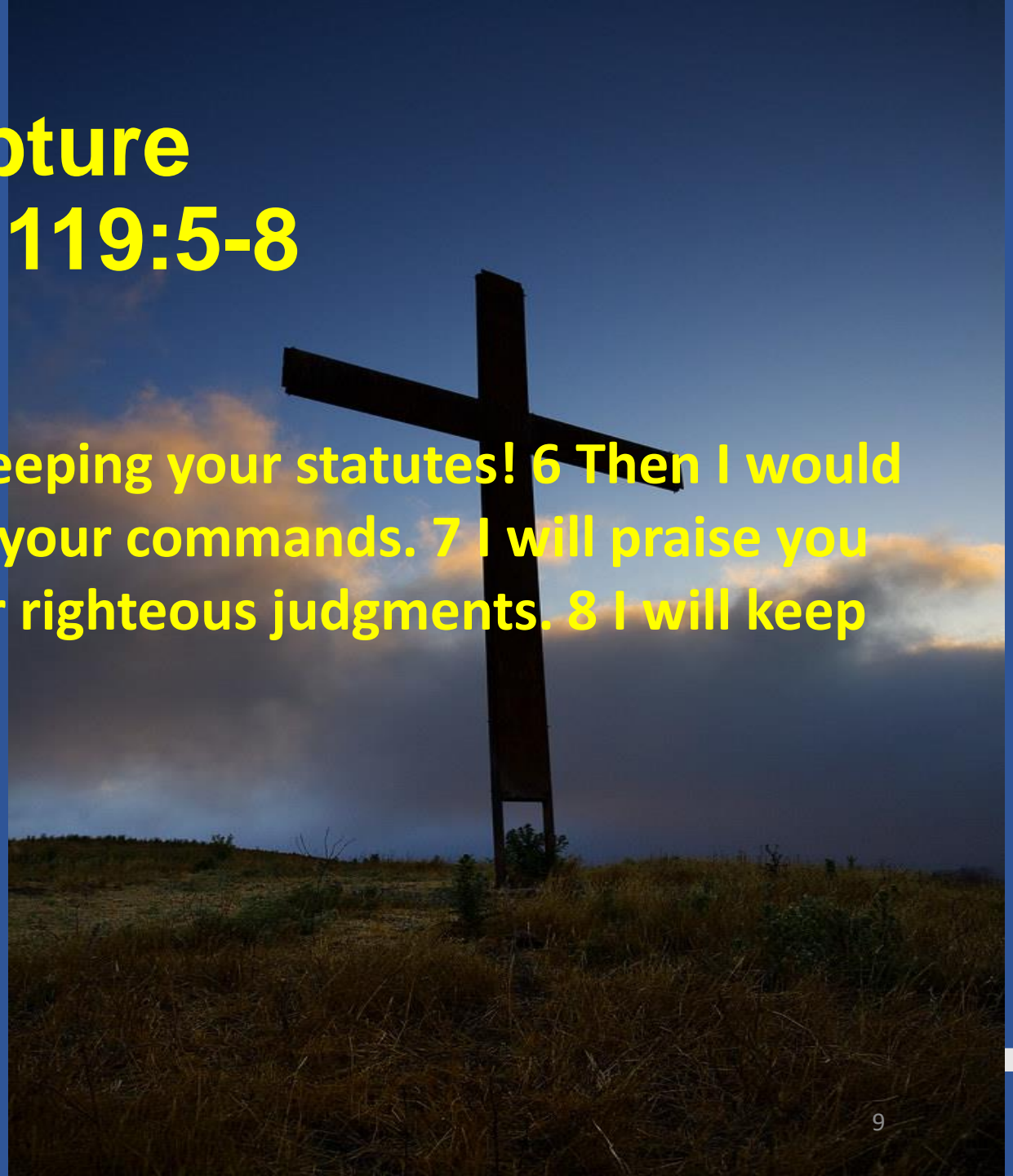
- The psalmist tells us the extent to which we need to walk according to God's Word.

# Committed to His Word

# Committed to His Word

## Psalm 119:9-11

---

- There is an inseparable connection between living right and obeying God's Word
  - Treasure God's word in your heart.
  - We should feed regularly and getting nourished with scripture so not to be easily tempted to sin.
  - When we treasure and store up God's Word in our hearts, we feast on His goodness and provision.

# GROWING IN CHRIST IN ACTION

AUGUST 30, 2020

- **Read His Word.** If God's Word hasn't been a part of your life, begin now. Take time every day to read Scripture and meditate on what you read. A good place to start is the Gospel of John. Before you read, ask God to speak to you. He loves you and desperately wants to meet you in that time with Him.
- **Hide His Word.** Consider practical ways to effectively store up God's Word in your heart. For example, download an audio Bible and commit to listening to God's Word when you're in your car. Use an app like Scripture Memory Bible to help you memorize Scripture.
- **Share His Word.** Commit to helping others know God's Word. Start a Bible study. Reach out to those not currently in a small group. Or, find a friend to study the same passage of Scripture with you every week. Meet up and share any questions you have and what God taught you through His Word.

# Final thoughts about Christ's Commitment to Us



- The blessing comes when our whole heart is in it.
- Complete obedience to God's Word brings blessings.
- Seeking the fullness of life apart from obedience to God's Word never works. Never.
- The psalmist is to be commended for his desire to be obedient—a desire we also should embrace—but we know as the psalmist did that remaining steadfast in obedience can be hard.
