
Class Norms


Growing in Christ



moment of joy?




Christian Love


John 15:15-17

John 15:15-17



- Jesus is our Lord and Master and has the right to call us servant, but he calls us friend.
- Jesus loved us to chose us and considers us his friend.
- Jesus commmands that you love them and he will give you the strength to do it.
