Acts 9:26-28**

26 When he arrived in Jerusalem, he tried to join the disciples, but they were all afraid of him, since they did not believe he was a disciple. 27 Barnabas, however, took him and brought him to the apostles and explained to them how Saul had seen the Lord on the road and that the Lord had talked to him, and how in Damascus he had spoken boldly in the name of Jesus. 28 Saul was coming and going with them in Jerusalem, speaking boldly in the name of the Lord.

Acts 9:26-28

- **Barnabas showed three ways to encourage others. The first way is by encouraging acceptance.**
- **God used Barnabas to bring Saul to a place of prominence. The apostles may not have rejected Saul outright, but they certainly kept their distance. Saul was not the kind of person a Christian would want to be around. Christians were known to end up in trouble—or dead—when Saul came around (Acts 26:9-11). Even though Saul’s heart had been changed completely after an encounter with Jesus, the believers in Jerusalem didn’t dare trust him.**

21 The Lord's hand was with them, and a large number who believed turned to the Lord. 22 News about them reached the church in Jerusalem, and they sent out Barnabas to travel as far as Antioch. 23 When he arrived and saw the grace of God, he was glad and encouraged all of them to remain true to the Lord with devoted hearts, 24 for he was a good man, full of the Holy Spirit and of faith. And large numbers of people were added to the Lord.

- While in Antioch, Barnabas's second way he encouraged others was by encouraging growth.
- Barnabas presents a wonderful example of how to help new Christians.
- He demonstrated strong faith, he ministered joyfully with kindness and encouragement and he believe in the power of the Holy Spirit to transform a person's life regardless of their past.

Antioch. For a whole year they met with the
church and taught large numbers. The
disciples were first called Christians at Antioch.**

Acts 11:25-26

- The third way Barnabas encouraged was by encouraging service.
- Barnabas invested in Paul, his leadership and his future in ministry.
- The church of Jesus Christ should be the most encouraging place on earth. Homes committed to Christ should be greenhouses of growth for young children coming up in them. Good words encourage growth. And they should encourage others to step up and serve.



GROWING IN CHRIST IN ACTION

- **Express thanks.** Express thanks to someone who has been an encouragement to you. Be specific regarding how his or her words or actions helped you.
- **Evaluate your life.** Consider whether people are encouraged by your example or actions. Consider what you might need to change to be an encourager like Barnabas.
- **Encourage each other.** Share ways each person in the group lives out one or more of the character traits in the fruit of the Spirit (Galatians 5:22-23).

Final thoughts about Encourage



- Believer grows strong through regular encouraging.
- As we have received encouragement, we should offer the same support to someone else. Our relationships will be strengthened when we open our hearts this way.
